Notes: *Course numbers falling within the range 3000-5000 are undergraduate courses, while those greater than 5000 indicate graduate courses. **This question asks students: “Taking into account the many qualities that contribute to good teaching, rate your professor on his/her overall effectiveness as a teacher.” ***This score is an average of multiple questions about the course, including whether: the instructor explains things clearly and facilitates questions/discussion; the course was challenging/demanding/improved the student’s ability to think; and the course was well-organized, with assignments and activities that helped students learn.
